Fast and Furious 9: The Fast Saga The result of poorly managed health and safety

A production company was fined after a stunt performer was injured during the filming of Fast and Furious 9: The Fast Saga.

Joe Watts, from Surrey, sustained life-changing injuries after he fell approximately 25 feet at Warner Bros. studios in Leavesden, Hertfordshire on 22 July 2019. Mr Watts fell 25 feet onto the concrete floor below when the line on his stunt vest became detached.

An investigation found several health and safety failings.
